HISTORY

This group is for people who want to combine learning new things with meeting new people. Our focus is on history but we roam widely around a range of subjects. The group meets on Wednesdays between 1.30 p.m. and 3.30 p.m. During the next few months we will be looking at four subjects:

The Roman invasions of Britain by Julius Caesar and the Emperor Claudius, marked the first time Britain was ruled by Europe.

History of Pets

We will look at when people first started to domesticate animals and how this relationship changed both parties.

The life and Influence of Edward Rushton

Liverpool Poet, Abolitionist and Campaigner for the Sight Impaired.

The Birth of Sefton

To mark the founding of the Borough of Sefton 50 years ago we will look at what happened, why it happened and what people thought of the change.

The life and influence of Edward Rushton, the founder of the Liverpool School for the Blind.


20th March—Happy Birthday Sefton
